

**2025 WWGA Annual Meeting Combined with the Albin Farm Show
February 5, 2025**

WWGA President, Derek Jackson, and Jeremiah Johnson opened the annual meeting with a welcome.

NAWG President, Keeff Felty, and Jake Westlin, NAWG VP of Policy and Communications started the meeting with a recorded talk about Senate confirmations, tariffs, the farm bill and Econ assistance.

Tyllor Ledford, Market Analyst at US Wheat Associates, then spoke through a zoom presentation about US Wheat's history and the current market worldwide including supply and demand.

Keith Kennedy, Executive Director of the Wheat Marketing Commission was the next presenter. He gave updates about weather stations, on-farm trials and small plot trials. He then provided an update on the Wyoming Legislative session, highlighting bills related to glyphosate and foreign ownership as well as an amendment to the supplemental budget.

Next, Nate Powell-Palm and Jeremiah Johnson each gave informative presentations about the opportunities, challenges and programs to help with growing organic wheat.

The annual business meeting was next. The following slate of officers for 2025 was elected by motion and unanimous vote: President – Derek Jackson (1 yr), Vice-President – Ken Tremain (1 yr), Recording Secretary – Tom Watson (1 yr), Laramie County Director – Theron Anderson (3 yr), Platte County Director – Chuck Maike (3 yrs), Director At-Large – Bill Daugherty (1 yr). The director for Goshen County didn't receive any nominations, so it will remain open. The following 2 resolutions passed by motion and unanimous vote:

1. *To ensure fairness to U.S. wheat farmers and the U.S. vital wheat gluten manufacturing industry, the WWGA supports oversight of vital wheat gluten imports to prevent vital wheat gluten dumping in the U.S. marketplace.*
2. *To increase market transparency, the WWGA supports a congressional mandate requiring U.S. importers of wheat to report volumes on a weekly basis in the same manner as exporters.*

The remainder of the meeting was combined with the Albin Farm Show. After lunch, all exhibitors were introduced by Derek Jackson and Jeremiah Johnson.

Bart Moseman, VP of Grain with Legacy COOP provided a market analysis focusing on supply & demand, exports and opportunity.

Don Day, DayWeather meteorologist, gave an engaging talk on the current and extended forecasts using ENSO phases coupled with past analogous years.

21st Century Equipment gave a presentation of the new technology upgrades and advancements for 2025 from John Deere.

The afternoon was closed with the drawing of door prizes.
