

**2026 WWGA Annual Meeting Combined with the Albin Farm Show
February 3, 2026**

WWGA President, Derek Jackson, and Jeremiah Johnson opened the annual meeting with a welcome.

NAWG Policy Manager, Anthony Peña started the meeting with a zoom presentation regarding the recent meeting, the partial Gov shutdown and spending agreements, farmer assistance programs, the Farm Bill update, and impacts from MAHA.

Dalton Henry, Vice President of Policy & Communication at US Wheat Associates, then gave an engaging talk via zoom presentation about current export markets, trade deals/talks/MOUs, tariffs and an update on the Food for Peace program.

Keith Kennedy, Executive Director of the Wheat Marketing Commission was the next presenter. He provided information about on-farm and small plot trials, the Monsanto case which is now at the Supreme Court, bills that will be brought to the Wyoming Legislature this year. An update on EPA changes in herbicide regulations was provided by Slade Franklin.

The annual business meeting was next. A floor nomination was made and seconded for President – Bill Daugherty and Vice President – Jeremiah Johnson. A motion to cease nominations was made, seconded and passed. The following slate of officers for 2026 was elected by motion and unanimous vote: President – Bill Daugherty (1 yr), Vice-President – Jeremiah Johnson (1 yr), Recording Secretary – Tom Watson (1 yr), Laramie County Director – Theron Anderson (3 yr), Platte County Director – Chuck Maike (3 yrs), Goshen County Director – Ken Tremain, Past President – Derek Jackson. The Director At-Large didn't receive any nominations, so it will remain open. The Financial Report was presented. Input was received on the current format of the WWGA Annual Meeting/Albin Farm Show.

The remainder of the meeting was combined with the Albin Farm Show. Before lunch, all exhibitors were introduced by Derek Jackson and Jeremiah Johnson.

Reg Preston, owner of the Grand Republic Milling Company and farm provided an informative talk about their farming and milling techniques and products.

Justin Fornstrum, HD 10 Legislator spoke on his priorities as a legislator which included integrity, agriculture and limited government. He answered some questions regarding the issues.

High West Energy conducted an interesting and informative demonstration on powerline safety.

Blaine Magnuson, Agronomist with Legacy COOP gave an update on the fertilizer market and provided some ways to improve fields and crops.

The afternoon was closed with the drawing of door prizes.
